How has FlexNet Manager's new database-powered reporting engine improved performance?

Significantly. FlexNet Manager's new database-powered reporting engine lets you generate reports far faster with even more accurate data than before. Customers of Flexera Software's SAM products will also notice how much faster, more accurate, and more stable FlexNet Manager's reporting is than SAM.

Can I use my current reporting tool to query the FlexNet Manager database?

Yes. FlexNet Manager's database is open, so customers who have their own reporting tools built on top of FlexNet Manager can use those tools to query the new database.

What are FLEXenabled applications and why is FlexNet Manager the only solution that can track and manage them?

Flexera Software, the company that develops FlexNet Manager, has a product called FlexNet Publisher that software producers use to better manage the licensing of their products. Their products that use FlexNet Publisher have been "FLEXenabled". Because FlexNet Publisher and FlexNet Manager use the same patented licensing technology, FlexNet Manager is the only solution with direct access to the FLEX license usage information, enabling enterprises to track and manage their FLEXenabled software with the most comprehensive and accurate usage reports.

Can I use FlexNet Manager to track applications that aren't FLEXenabled?

Yes, you can. For back-office applications, like Oracle datacenters, you can use the new Extensible Monitoring add-on to define and monitor software usage as it relates to unique business needs and vendor contract terms. Offering far more than just a snapshot in time, you can use FlexNet Manager to constantly monitor activity and collect usage data, even when the systems are unconnected. You can then identify trends to better anticipate future needs and accurately manage on-going compliance – all without time-consuming manual audits.

For Windows applications, your IT team can use AdminStudio software packaging solution to inject license tracking capabilities into them – a process known as FLEXwrapping – before deployment, making them visible to FlexNet Manager.

Is FlexNet Manager suited to both large enterprises and small companies?

Yes. Whether you manage 20 license daemons or 500, FlexNet Manager's Web-based interface provides a single-console view of all your FLEXenabled licenses, making them easy to manage. And because FlexNet Manager is so simple to use, smaller companies with limited IT resources can still manage all their licenses with ease.

How easy is it for new users to learn to use this software?

FlexNet Manager is easy to learn. The Web-based interface is designed to make it easy for licensing novices to proactively manage licenses. Many of the basic licensing functions can be automated, and it has alerts that can notify you of problems before they significantly impact your end users.

Can I import data (other than LDAP) to cross reference against my usage data?

Organizational data can be imported into FlexNet Manager via XML. As long as you organize your data, whether it is LDAP data or not, using the format described in our Reporting Guide, you can import this data into FlexNet Manager and report upon it.
